

I was Hungry

You see, my beloved, there is no excuse for it. They knew what they had to do in this world. The **Sunday of Meat-Fare** is also called the **Sunday of the Last Judgment** in which we are only eight days from the start of the Great Fast. Today’s Gospel story is about the second coming of the Lord in glory, and of the final judgment.
