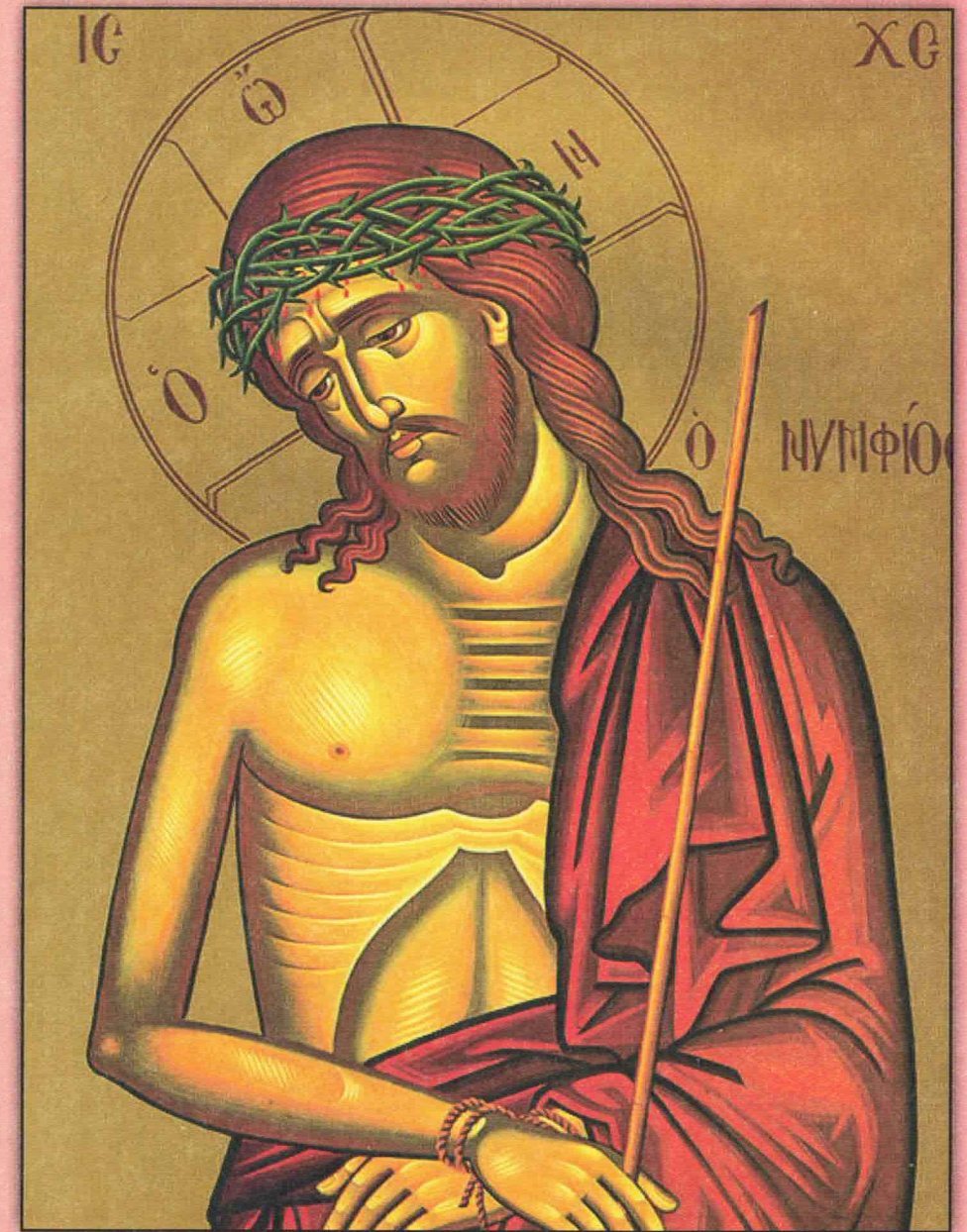
When I see my deeds that deserve such punishment, I am without hope, O Lord; for I have disobeyed Your holy commandments, and I have led a foolish

life. Therefore, I beseech You: purify me in the waters of repentance by fasting and prayer, O Savior, full of goodness; do not reject me, O Benefactor of the Universe.

Let us begin the time of this bright fast, giving ourselves over to spiritual struggle. Let us sanctify our soul and purify our flesh. Let us not fast only from food; let us also abstain from every passion and cultivate spiritual virtues. And let us faithfully preserve in this, so that we may be worthy to see the holy passion of Christ our God and the joy of His holy Resurrection.

### The Sunday of Forgiveness (Cheesefare)

The Sunday of Forgiveness is the last Sunday before the Start of the Great Fast (Clean Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup>). The Sunday of Forgiveness focus is placed on the exile of Adam and Eve from the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve were blessed with a beautiful relationship with God. However, they were tempted by the devil appearing in the form of a serpent to disobey God and eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. This event shows us how far we have fallen in sin and separated ourselves from God. During The Great Fast, it's a period of fasting. Today's Gospel reminds us of our need for God's forgiveness and guides our hearts, minds, and spiritual efforts on returning to him in repentance.

In the Bible, look up this quote in **Matthew 6:14-15**. Using these words, fill in the blanks:

- The law of simple abstinence forbids the use of meat, but permits the use of eggs and dairy products.
  - All faithful of the Eparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe simple abstinence when prescribed.
- Abstinence is obligatory on all Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great Fast.

[strict abstinence](#)

- The law of strict abstinence (fasting) forbids the use and consumption of all meat, eggs and dairy products.
- All faithful of the Eparchy who receive the Eucharist are obliged to observe strict abstinence when prescribed.
- Strict abstinence (fasting) is to be observed in 2026 on Pure Monday, February 16<sup>th</sup> (the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the Great Fast), and on Great and Holy Friday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>.
