#### ASK THE DEACON: What is meant by "Presanctified" Liturgy?

**ANSWER:** The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts (Slavonic: *Liturgija Preždeoscjaščénnych Darov*) is a service unique to the Byzantine Rite. It is celebrated during the Great Fast, and provides the faithful with the opportunity to receive Holy Communion on those days when the Eucharistic Sacrifice is not celebrated. The word "presanctified" indicates that the "gifts" (the Body and Blood of Christ), which are distributed at the service, are those consecrated at a previous celebration of the Divine Liturgy of Saint John Chrysostom or the Divine Liturgy of Saint Basil the Great. The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts is celebrated on Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great Fast, the evenings of certain major feast days during the Fast, and the first three days of Great and Holy Week. Where there is a custom or pastoral need, it may be celebrated on any weekday (Monday through Friday) of the Great Fast. This service is not celebrated on Saturday or Sunday.
