"ASK THE DEACON" – THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: Why do some Eastern Rite Churches have different color domes, and what do the colors represent?

ANSWER: Here is one (short) commonly given explanation: "The color of church cupolas can be also interpreted according to the church symbolism. The golden color is the symbol of celestial glory, that is why golden domes crowned main cathedrals consecrated to Jesus Christ and Twelve Great Feasts. Blue domes with golden stars are characteristic of Mother of God churches. Churches in honor of saints are often topped with green or silver domes. In monasteries and convents one can see black cupolas – symbols of monkhood." From https://bridgetomoscow.com/curious-fact-shape-and-color-of-russian-domes.
