CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS: The priest's sacristy was painted, brighter lighting was installed, the closet was reconfigured, and new furniture was purchased to better organize liturgical items.

"ASK THE DEACON" – THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: Why does Father hold his arms up during the Our Father?

ANSWER: At the Cherubic Hymn the priest and deacon are specifically directed to pray "with hands elevated on high" as is the priest at the Lord's Prayer. This is a very ancient posture for prayer. "Among the subjects depicted in the art of the Roman catacombs one of those most numerously represented is that of a female figure with extended arms known as the Orans, or one who prays. The custom of praying in antiquity with outstretched, raised arms was common to both Jews and Gentiles" (The 1911 Catholic Encyclopedia). We encounter this too when we sing from Psalm 141 at the Presanctified Liturgy: "Let my prayer ascend to you like incense, and the lifting up of my hands like as evening sacrifice."
