**BLESSED THEODORE G. ROMZHA:** Blessed Theodore George Romzha (4/17/1911 – 11/1/1947) was the Bishop of the Ruthenian Catholic Eparchy of Mukachevo from 1944 to 1947. Bishop Romzha was beatified as a martyr by Pope John Paul II on June 27, 2001. His relics are enshrined in Holy Cross Cathedral in Uzhorod, Transcarpathia. "ASK THE DEACON" - THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: Why are saints so important to us?

**ANSWER:** The word Saint means the Holy-one. In the New and the Old Testaments, it refers to God's people, living and dead, who together form the communion of saints. For example: Psalm 34:10 Fear the LORD, you his holy ones (saints); Rom 1:7 To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints; 2 Cor 13:13 All the saints greet you. We are called to be what God is: Lev 11:44 For I am the LORD your God; consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I am holy. The Church declares some deceased faithful to be saints: they have lived a holy life, and so we honor and venerate them as examples of a life in Christ. The Pope's proclamation of someone as a saint says (in Latin): "In honor of the Holy Trinity, for the exaltation of the Catholic faith and the increase of the Christian life, with the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Holy Apostles Peter and Paul and of Our Own, after long reflection, having invoked divine assistance many times and listened to the opinion of many of our Brothers in the Episcopate, We declare and define as Saint Blessed N. and inscribe his/her name in the list of the saints and establish that throughout the Church they be devoutly honored among the saints."
