
TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST ENTRANCE OF THE THEOTOKOS INTO THE TEMPLE

This is the **26th Sunday – The Entrance of the Theotokos into the Temple.** Propers begin on page 268; Tone 1, page 125. **Slava Isusu Christu! Slava na viki! Glory to Jesus Christ! Glory forever!** **SUNDAY OBLIGATION:** Bishop Kurt revoked the dispensation, regarding the Sunday precept or obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy, on June 6, 2021. Watching the live stream no longer fulfills the obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy. However, the Bishop reminds everyone that "just as before the pandemic, anyone is relieved of the obligation for serious reason such as sickness, immobility, fear, caring for someone else, to protect your own health, or the health of others." Our parish continues to be cleaned and hand sanitizer is available throughout the church.

2021 BISHOP'S APPEAL: The Bishop's Appeal began on November 1, 2021. Pledges and payments will be accepted through June 30, 2021. Any contributions received after December 31, 2021, must be attributed to the 2022 tax year. Our parish goal, for this year's campaign, is \$9,800.00. If you don't receive a pledge form in the mail, there are a few extra copies on the shelf in the Narthex.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Fr. Serhii is available 15 minutes before or immediately after Divine Liturgy to hear confession. *On December 19th, Fr. Serhii will be hearing confession for the children in ECF.* These children should gather in the front of church after Liturgy. Parents, please review the confession prayer with your children. 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Dear brothers and sisters!

Today's Feast of the Entry into the Church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, shows us the solemn entrance of the little girl, Mary, into the Jerusalem Temple. In the example of her righteous parents, we see a spirit of great humility and complete hope in God.

The Immaculate Conception and Nativity of Mary was the first step in the realization of the mystery of salvation, and her upbringing in the temple was a preparation for full agreement with God's will and conscious acceptance of God's plan for the salvation of mankind, which began with the birth of Jesus Christ. To carry out his plan, God chose the Virgin Mary as the future Mother of the Son of God. Mary's first spiritual preparation for this great mission was accomplished by God through her righteous parents, Joachim and Anna.

"The angels of God," says George of Nicomedia," surrounded her invisibly and served her at God's command. There, from above, she was met and blessed by the high priest, Zechariah, the father of St. John the Baptist. The temple minister did not stop where people usually prayed, and by the command of God, he led the Blessed Virgin Mary further.

Blessed Theophylact says this: "The bishop at that time, under the influence of the Holy Spirit, understood that this Adolescent is a container of Divine grace. She is more worthy than him to stand before the Face of the Living God. And when he remembered what was said in the Law of the Ark of the Covenant, which was always to be in the Holy of Holies, he realized that was a direct reference to this Maiden. And so, without any doubt, he dared, contrary to the decisions, to bring her there."

One day in the Belgian town of Gal, a young merchant, walking along the river, heard a woman screaming. He looked around and saw that a child was drowning in the waves of the river, and a sobbing mother was screaming on the shore. Without thinking for a long time, this merchant jumped into the water and saved the child. This mother was very happy and could not find the words to thank the rescuer for saving her son. The merchant did not want any reward. But the mother removed the silver medal of the Mother of God, from the boy and, giving it to the merchant, said, "The Mother of God helped you to save my child, let her help you in your future life." The young merchant was not a great zealot of religion and prayer, but he accepted the medal and gave his word that he would pray. Years had passed since this case. The merchant went to overseas countries for their trade. During this time, the little boy had grown into a handsome young man and dedicated himself to serving God, became a missionary priest, and was sent on a mission to Africa as a capable missionary. One day, he was told that a seriously ill merchant was lying in the city hospital, who was probably a Christian, but did not want to confess. The disease was severe, and the patient barely spoke, every minute could be the last. When the priest arrived at the patient's ward, he noticed a medal on his neck and inquired about it. The patient began to tell the story of a boy rescued near the town of Gal in Belgium. "I was the boy you rescued," he said. The priest, with tears in his eyes, threw himself into the arms of his sick rescuer. In this wave, the ray of God's grace warmed and enlightened the hardened heart of the old merchant. Now he realized that it was the Blessed Virgin Mary who took care of him in such an extraordinary way that the boy to whom he had saved earthly life had to save his soul for eternity.

The sick merchant wept like a child, and sincerely repented all of his life. He confessed, said goodbye to this world, calmly, without fear, and departed to the afterlife.

Today's holy day, dear believers, can symbolically be called a children's holy day. After all, we Christians, from early childhood, must bring our children to the Temple, teach them and consecrate them to God, just as the holy and righteous Godfathers Joachim and Anna. To consecrate means to give to the will of God, to the care of God, so that our children may grow up under the grace of God and the protection of the Blessed Virgin. And for this, we ourselves need to grow spiritually, ascending as steps of life to the Lord. Day by day, we approach the meeting with Him, where the Great High Priest - Christ Himself - is waiting for us at the top of the steps. He will take us by the hand and lead us into His abode. And in this spiritual ascent up the steps of life, may the Blessed Virgin Mary herself be our greatest helper, mentor, and patron.
