SUNDAY OBLIGATION: Bishop Kurt revoked the dispensation, regarding the Sunday precept or obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy, on June 6, 2021. Watching the live stream no longer fulfills the obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy. However, the Bishop reminds everyone that "just as before the pandemic, anyone is relieved of the obligation for serious reason such as sickness, immobility, fear, caring for someone else, to protect your own health, or the health of others." Our parish continues to be cleaned and hand sanitizer is available throughout the church.

2021 BISHOP'S APPEAL: The Bishop's Appeal began on November 1, 2021. Pledges and payments will be accepted through June 30, 2021. Sunday before Christmas

Dear brothers and sisters!

Here we are again, this year, approaching the long-awaited and joyful holiday - Christmas. Celebrating the Nativity of our Savior Jesus Christ, we remember the circumstances of his birth: a poor stable, escape to Egypt ...

By his birth, Christ reminds us that the Kingdom of Heaven is near and the way is open. It originates here on earth, where Christ is, when his love is in the hearts of men and unites them: husband and wife in marriage, children and parents in the family, Christians in the parish community. When the Pharisees once asked Christ when the Kingdom of Heaven would come, He replied, "The kingdom of God will come unnoticed; they shall not say, Behold, it is here. - or: He's there! For the Kingdom of God is among you "(Luke 17:21). A special sign of the presence of Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of God on earth is his Church and the Holy Mysteries in it, and in particular the Holy Eucharist, where the living Christ is present in the form of bread and wine.

The Holy Fathers assure us that our salvation is happening here and now on earth, and we receive its fullness in eternity. Thus the words of Christ are fulfilled: "He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, liveth everlasting life" (Jn 5:24), "He that eateth my flesh and drinketh my blood liveth eternal life" (Jn 6:54). Because when we are united with Jesus Christ, we are united with God, the source of our happiness.

Thanks to Jesus, we can already here on earth know and feel the blissful state of heaven, the fruits of our salvation: lack of patience, peace and lasting joy. This is confirmed by the words of the funeral prayer: "Lord, rest the souls of your servants, where there is no pain, no sorrow, no sighing, but life is endless." The Apostle John assures us of this in the words of the book of Revelation: "God himself will be with them, and will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death, no sorrow, no crying, no pain, for all that has passed is past" (Rev. 21, 3-4). "For he is our peace," adds the Apostle Paul.

40 students were interviewed at one university. The professor asked them to write the word "Christmas" and everything that reminds them. For most students, Christmas was associated with the following words: "Christmas tree", "gifts", "dinner", "guests", "entertainment". Unfortunately, none of the respondents mentioned the birth of Jesus Christ in a word. And most people, when celebrating Christmas, do not think about who is the cause of that holiday.

Dear believers! As we prepare for Christmas, let us prepare a stable in our hearts for the baby Jesus. And as the sages from the east came to the newborn, so I invite you all to come and celebrate his birth together in our Church.


