"ASK THE DEACON" – THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: Why is St. Nicholas so important for us?

ANSWER: *St. Nicholas, Patron of the Byzantine Catholic Church* is one of the most popular and venerated Saints among the Ruthenian people. St. Nicholas the Wonderworker, the Archbishop of Myra in Lycia, Asia Minor, died in the middle of the fourth century. His name is equally honored among the Christians of the East, where he lived and died, and of the West... According to tradition, St. Nicholas of Myra was born about 270 A.D. in Patara, a small town in the province of Lycia (presently in Turkey), the only son of a rich family. Attracted to the religious life, he spurned his inherited wealth and used it for charitable work, for which he became famous in his youth....

As a Spiritual Shepherd, St. Nicholas distinguished himself for his pastoral zeal and uncommon goodness of heart. He also worked miracles which made people consider him a Saint even before his death. He strongly defended the Faith at the Nicean Council (325).... He assisted the poor, protected the innocent, comforted the suffering and the sick. Several times during his episcopacy, St. Nicholas saved his people from imminent starvation. He died on December 6, 345 or 352, and is commemorated in the liturgical calendar on the anniversary of his holy death.... The Ruthenian people, who were always poor and oppressed, admired St. Nicholas especially for his works of charity.... We extol you, Holy Father Nicholas, and we celebrate your memory, for you intercede for us with Christ our God. (From the Matins for the Feast of St. Nicholas.).
