

GREAT BLESSING OF THE WATER/MIROVANIJE AND ANOINTING: In the Byzantine Catholic Church, the Solemn Blessing of the Water commemorates Christ's baptism in the River Jordan. It is customary to drink of the Holy Water for the "purification of your soul and body, and cure of any weakness." Taking Holy Water to your home is to have in it a fount of continued blessings and protection against all evil. Fr. Vasyl will have the Blessing of the Water during Divine Liturgy today, and will be available for you to take some home. You can use this Holy Water when you are sick, or bless things in your home. Please do not pour last year's Holy Water down the drain, it is consecrated. Either continue to use it, or pour it on the ground, where it won't be walked on. There are a limited number of Holy Water bottles for sale if you need to purchase one. Prices are marked on the container. You can leave your payment for the water bottle in the basket. At the conclusion of Liturgy today, we will also have Mirovanije and Anointing.

THE BYZANTINE RITE LITURGICAL PRACTICE OF OBSERVING ALL SOULS SATURDAYS: In the Byzantine Liturgical Year there are five All Souls Saturdays – namely, Meat Fare Saturday, the Second, Third, and Fourth Saturdays of the Great Lent, and Pentecost Saturday. Our first All Souls service will be held on Friday, February 2, 2024. Every year, we request that parishioners submit a list of their departed loved ones called a "Hramoty." These lists will be put into a booklet form, and the names will be mentioned at the services held for the deceased on All Souls Saturday. Please remember to write the names legibly. Members of the family are encouraged to attend these services on the All Souls Saturdays, for by your presence and personal prayers, it strengthens the bond with your departed loved ones, and indeed keeps their memory eternal! VIČNAJA PAMJAT'! A "Hramoty" form is included with this bulletin. If you receive church envelopes, you can also use the envelope that was mailed to you. All forms and/or envelopes can either be mailed to our church, or dropped in the collection basket. Please submit your "Hramoty" list no later than Sunday, January 28th, in order to have them included in the booklet.

A TRADITION IN THE BYZANTINE CHURCH - THE BLESSING OF CANDLES ON THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD IN THE TEMPLE: On Friday, February 2nd, we will also have The Blessing of Candles. In our churches today, the Presence of a burning vigil-light indicates the Real Presence of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist on the altar. St. John the Evangelist presented Our Lord Jesus Christ to us in his gospel as the "Light of Life." The burning candle presented to us at Baptism is a symbol of the new spiritual life we receive through the sacrament. Burning candles held by our altar servers, one on each side of the Gospel during the reading, reminds us that the teaching of Christ should enlighten us and guide us on our way to salvation as indicated by the words of Our Lord Himself. "I am the light of the world; anyone who follows Me will not be walking in the dark, but will have the light of life." The burning candles in front of our holy icons should remind us of the light of the exemplary lives they lived and inspire us to model our lives after theirs in imitation of their "good works." The ritual of the Church also prescribes that at least two candles be lit on the altar at all liturgical services. Burning candles in our churches remind us that our prayers should come from a heart burning with love of God and they should be directed toward heaven, where God abides in the "inaccessible light." In this manner, candles make a positive contribution to the fervor of our prayers. The burning of a votive candle in church, besides its sacrificial value (donation), has also a symbolic meaning, namely, the continuation of our prayers after we leave the church.

The custom of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation was introduced to fill the "needs of the people." In homes, the blessed candles are lighted and placed before a holy icon in time of serious sickness, distress, or the threat of a storm to implore Divine protection, as the family is gathered in prayer. The burning candle symbolizes the abiding presence of Jesus Christ in the midst of the Christian community as He, Himself, had promised: "Where two or three are gathered in My Name, there I am in their midst."

You are, therefore, welcome to bring your own candle(s) from home to have blessed, or we will have candles available for purchase. More details to follow.

The Opening Liturgy begins Thursday, January 18<sup>th</sup>, at 5pm, followed by a Holy Hour for Life starting at 7pm. The Closing Liturgy begins Friday at 8am. 

# Let Us Venerate Today the Baptism of Christ ... Wash Yourselves and Be Clean

I cannot restrain my joy; my heart is deeply moved and filled with delight. Forgetting my weakness, I long to undertake the mission of the great John the Baptist; though I am not the Forerunner, I have indeed come from the desert!

Christ receives the sacrament of enlightenment, or rather He enlightens us with His brilliance. He is baptized; let us go down into the water with Him so that we may also come up with Him. John is baptizing, and Jesus comes to him. Christ certainly sanctifies the man who now baptizes Him, but His purpose is chiefly to bury the old Adam in the waters and, above all, to sanctify the waters of the Jordan by His baptism in them so that just as He was spirit and flesh, those who would later be baptized might be sanctified by the power of the Spirit and by water.

John refuses; Jesus insists. "It is you that should be baptizing me!" says John. The torch addresses the Sun, the voice speaks to the Word. Jesus comes out of the water, drawing the world with Him, as it were, and raising it up when it had hitherto been sunk in the abyss. He sees the heavens not being rent, but opening of their own accord.

The first Adam had of old closed heaven to himself and us, just as he had seen the earthly paradise being closed to him, with a fiery sword barring access. The Holy Spirit bears witness. Here all is in perfect harmony, for the testimony comes from heaven, just as He to whom the Spirit bears witness has come from heaven.

St. Gregory the Theologian

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
