Byzantine Catholic Eparchy of Passaic Fasting Regulations for the Great Fast 2023

Abstinence:

- The law of Abstinence forbids the use of meat, permitting the use of eggs and dairy products.
- All the faithful of the Eparchy who receive Holy Communion are obliged to abstain.
- Abstinence is to be observed on all Wednesdays and Fridays during the Holy Season of the

Great Fast.

Strict Abstinence:

- The law of Strict Abstinence (Fast) forbids the use of meat, eggs, and dairy products.
- All the adult faithful of the Eparchy who receive Holy Communion are obliged to observe

Strict Abstinence.

- Strict Abstinence is to be observed on the First Day of the Great Fast, Pure Monday, February 20 and on Great and Holy Friday, April 7.

2nd Sunday of the Great Fast (contemplation)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

After the Last Supper, before his torment, Jesus Christ said to his disciples, "Abide in My Love" (Jn. 15:9). But what can encourage us to love someone more than the good deeds he has done for us?

The greatest goodness of Jesus Christ for us, the most obvious proof of His Love is His consecration, His suffering, His death for us. He himself said to the disciples on this occasion, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends, but you are my friends" (John 15:13).

Let us remember that Jesus Christ revealed His Heart to St. Margaret with the instrument of torment. "I saw," says St. Margarita, "The Heart of Jesus as if on a fiery throne, from that Heart, wrapped in a crown of thorns, a cross rose, and the wound inflicted on Him on the cross was visible." At that revelation, Jesus Christ said, "Look! Here is the Heart that loved people so much!"

For the saints, it was the sweetest thing to look at the crucified Jesus Christ, to have before their eyes the image of the Heart of Christ the Lord pierced with a spear. And Jesus Christ let them know so many times how dear this piety was to him, many times he rewarded them with extraordinary favors.

This is true, because from this piety, from the cross, from the Heart of Jesus, a stream of grace flows endlessly to the world, and especially to the worshipers of the Heart of the Lord.

Saint Alphonsus saw how fiery arrows of Love came out of the wounds of the crucified Savior and wounded those who approached Christ. One pious person also saw a fiery ray emanating from the Heart of Christ the Lord and wounding the admirers of His Heart with arrows of love.

Why does Jesus Christ want to lay in our heart's devotion to his sufferings, to his cross? Because there we will know the infinite malice of our sins and be inflamed with love for Jesus. Seeing the Heart of Jesus pierced with a spear, we run to it as a source of grace in all our needs.

Saint Franz Seraphic had great devotion to the sufferings of Jesus Christ. Several times he heard the voice of the lamb, and he always burst into tears, because he remembered the Lamb of God, who washes away the sins of the world on the cross. Often walking with a cross, he cried, and showing it to people, he called out, "Love is not the beloved."

Once, when Franz embraced the cross and kissed the crucified Christ with great love, Jesus Christ lowered his right hand from the cross, wrapped it around Saint Franz and hugged him to Himself.


