REFLECTIONS ON THOMAS SUNDAY BY: DEACON ANTHONY

Today's Gospel speaks to us about doubts and about faith. The icon for today's feast shows us what we have just heard in the Gospel: Thomas, who doubted, stretching out his hand to Jesus who has command him to approach and to believe. Our icons traditionally have a descriptive title written on them, and in this case, it is also a catchy phrase: *The Touching*. Here, obviously, Thomas reaches out to touch Jesus so that he may believe; but in doing this Thomas is also, in return, touched by the Lord. Many of us, many in the world, can see ourselves in the position of Thomas, wanting to touch our Lord and be touched by Him in return so that our faith may be strengthened and our fears and doubts put to rest.

How do we, living in these times, touch the Lord so that we can also be touched by Him? Jesus is not present to us today exactly as He was 2000 years ago, as represented in the holy icon. Yet we say in one of our greetings, and it is certainly true, that "Christ is among us!" And we respond emphatically, "He is and shall be!" Jesus is present with us today, as in "The Touching," in the sacred mysteries (the sacraments), in the Church, His Body, and His Spouse.

Christ is Risen from the dead! * By death he trampled Death; * and to those in the tombs * he granted life.
