ASK THE DEACON: What is the significance of the Myrrh-Bearers that they have their own Sunday?

ANSWER: The icon of today's commemoration of the Myrrh-Bearing Women is entitled, *The Resurrection*. These women were the first witnesses to the Resurrection recorded in the Gospels. This is noted every Sunday in a special hymn that is chanted at Matins called the Hypakoe which means to hear or hearken, to respond or to be obedient. The Hypakoe of Pascha is the one most commonly known. It is sung after the third ode of the Paschal Canon, and refers to the Myrrh-Bearing Women being sent to announce the Resurrection to the Apostles.

Although you descended into the grave, O Immortal One, you destroyed Hades' power. You arose as a victor, O Christ God. You exclaimed to the myrrh-bearing women: Rejoice! You gave peace to your apostles and granted resurrection to the fallen (Kontakion of the Resurrection).
