
# THE ENTRANCE INTO JERUSALEM PALM SUNDAY

#### Byzantine Catholic Eparchy of Passaic Fasting Regulations for the Great Fast 2023

#### Abstinence:

- The law of Abstinence forbids the use of meat, permitting the use of eggs and dairy products.
- All the faithful of the Eparchy who receive Holy Communion are obliged to abstain.
- Abstinence is to be observed on all Wednesdays and Fridays during the Holy Season of the

#### Great Fast.

#### Strict Abstinence:

- The law of Strict Abstinence (Fast) forbids the use of meat, eggs, and dairy products.
- All the adult faithful of the Eparchy who receive Holy Communion are obliged to observe

#### Strict Abstinence.

- Strict Abstinence is to be observed on the First Day of the Great Fast, Pure Monday, February 20 and on Great and Holy Friday, April 7.

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#### **Reflections on the Passion of Christ**

The passion and death of Christ is the highest act of love. The Son of God, out of love for us, sacrificed himself for us in order to redeem us from eternal death and to find God's grace and the lost paradise for us. The Lord of the world deprived Himself of everything, "taking the form of a servant, becoming like a man."

But the most surprising and incomprehensible thing is that the Lord could save us without death and pain, but he chose for himself a life full of suffering and contempt, a cruel and shameful death -- the death of the cross, on the gallows, which is intended for criminals. "He humbled himself, becoming obedient unto death, and the death on the cross." God chose death on the cross to testify to us of His infinite love.

St. Francis de Sales also explains this passage from the letters of the Apostle Paul: "Do we realize that Jesus, the true God, loved us so much that he accepted death for us, and that death on the cross? Doesn't this give rise to the feeling in our heart that love is being extracted from our hearts under a strange pressure -- a love that is stronger, the more worthy of love it is?"

Jesus Christ's love for people was so great that He longed for the hour of His death so that He could show His love to people. "I have a baptism to be baptized with; and how I am constrained until it is accomplished" (Lk 12:50). That is why the Apostle John describes the night during which the Passion of Jesus began, "Now before the feast of the Passover, when Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart out of this world to the Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end" (John 13:1).

If only people, looking at the Crucified One, wanted to think about the love that He cherished for each of us! St. Francis de Sales said, "What kind of love would we ignite if we saw its flame in the Redeemer's heart? What a joy it is to be connected with God by a chain of love!" St. Bonaventure said of Christ's wounds that they wound the hardest hearts and inflame the most indifferent souls. How many merciful arrows come out of those wounds that aim at the hardest hearts! What a flame comes from the burning Heart of Jesus Christ, kindling the coldest! How many chains are obtained from the pierced side that bind unbreakable and rebellious souls!

"Oh, my Jesus, Savior of hearts, the power of your love broke even the hardest hearts! You set the whole world on fire with your love. O Lord, full of wisdom, fill my heart with Your peace, burn with Your fire, wound with the arrows of Your love! Your cross is like an arrow that wounds my heart. Let the whole world know that I too have a wounded heart! Lord, when I look at the cross, everything prompts me to love: the wood and the wounds of Your Body, and above all - Your love: it prompts me to love and desire to never forget You."

Last year's palms and pussy willows are blessed sacramentals and should be destroyed by burning or burying them. 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### Palm (Flowery) Sunday Sermon

"...Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord...!" (John 12:13)

#### Dear Brothers and Sisters!

During Great Lent, you and I are spiritually preparing for Easter, the Resurrection of the Lord. But from today, Palm Sunday, more intense preparations for the Easter days begin. At the beginning of Great Lent, you and I made certain decisions, we tried to limit ourselves in some ways in order to improve spiritually. Today, we can see in what we succeeded and in what we didn't. And today in our churches we hear that it is not too late to start our recovery, it is not too late to discover God's love for ourselves.

In today's Gospel reading, we heard about the miracle that Jesus performed with the dead Lazarus, who had been in the grave for four days. It was the resurrection of the righteous Lazarus that preceded the event of the Lord's entry into Jerusalem. The resurrection of the dead from today, from this day, brings our thoughts closer to the Resurrection of Christ, the resurrection of the Lord from the dead and His victory over death and hell. We will live all this during the next week.

Today, our Savior entered Jerusalem, He was greeted as a King. But no one expected and could not even imagine that the Kingdom of this King would begin with the Cross, with the Crucifixion, that is, with the renunciation of oneself, one's will, one's self. It is incredibly difficult to renounce oneself voluntarily, to the end, to the point of complete exhaustion. Having life, having complete freedom, to give it up, only because such is the will of God and such is His wonderful providence for us, because "...God so loved the world that He gave His only-begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

Metropolitan Anthony, of Sourozh, in one of his sermons said the following words, "...remembering the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, how terrible it is to see that a whole nation met the Living God, who came only with the message of love, love to the last --- and turned away from Him, because they were not looking for love, because it was scary to love as Christ commanded --- to the readiness to live for love and die for love. They preferred the perishable, \*they wanted the earthly. What remained was a desert, emptiness, nothingness..., but only God can fill with Himself those human depths in which there is emptiness and which cannot be filled with anything else. Only God can create harmony in human society; only God can turn a terrible desert into a blooming garden."

We meet in church on Palm Sunday with branches and palms in our hands. These willow branches and palms remind us not only of the joyful meeting of Jesus with the inhabitants of Jerusalem, but also of the fact that winter has ended. Spring has come, everything is turning green again and blooming, and will bear fruit. Winter is replaced by spring. We know that there is no human soul that could not warm up, revive and bear fruit. We look forward to the spring sun for our soul, when we can bring not only a green twig to meet the Lord, but also a warmed, revived soul. Our sun is the Lord, the flowers of our reviving soul are love for the Lord, for people, and for the world.

Dear believers! Today, you will carry home these consecrated willow branches and palms. You should bring not only these willow branches and palms, but also the mood of joy, peace, and gratitude. Those people, or your loved ones, who have not come to the temple, who do not know the joy of knowing God and the resurrection, can feel, at least a little, what the Lord's power is! What is the peace that Christ brings! What is the life that He gave us and still gives us today.
