ASK THE DEACON: Why is the feast of the descent of the Holy Spirit called Pentecost?

ANSWER: From Byzantine Catholics and the Feast of Pentecost: "Your good Spirit shall lead me into the land of righteousness. Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!" The descent of the Holy Spirit took place on the Jewish Pentecost (Acts 2:1), which coincided with the fiftieth day after the glorious resurrection of Christ. Therefore, the Apostles also referred to this memorable event as Pentecost (I Co. 16:8). But the celebration of this event as a separate feast came somewhat later, in the second half of the fourth century. St. Gregory of Nyssa (d. 394), in his homily "On Pentecost," already referred to it as the "Great Festivity of Pentecost." For the Christians it marked the completion of the redemptive work of Christ and the inauguration of the New Covenant, the Covenant of Grace which was poured down by the Holy Spirit. Pentecost is a constant reminder of our own "baptism by the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5), which we received at the time of our Chrismation (Confirmation). As the priest, anointing our body with the holy chrism (myro), pronounced the words: "The Seal of the Gift of the Holy Spirit," the heavens opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon us, taking possession of our soul.
