

12th Sunday after Pentecost

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

"What good thing can I do to have eternal life?" A young man approached Jesus with this question. Such a question is not asked by a young person nowadays as often as one would like. Today, a young person is more concerned about where to study, where to work, whom to marry, but does not think about life after life. And, the fact that the young man from the Gospel passage harbored such a question in himself testifies to his certain maturity as a person.

"Truly I say to you: It is difficult for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of Heaven. I also say to you: It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of God."

By the word "poor" we call those who have nothing or very little. We also include those who have lost something of a non-monetary nature: "Poor person, because he lost his health", "Poor person, because she lost a loved one." Poor because he or she is in some trouble. A rich person is one who has a lot. To be rich, it is not necessary to have a lot of material goods, you can have a lot of acquaintances, talents, friends.

In our world there are rich people, because there are those who have less and we call them poor. Unfortunately, a person uses enrichment for personal purposes and multiplies his or her wealth at the expense of others, thus making oneself rich, while another takes the place of the poor. And although one cannot exist without the other, the distance between these two was and will probably always exist in this society. Both are not always happy with who they are. The poor often want to become rich, and the rich dream of getting rid of everything that burdens their lives and makes them restless. Someone dreams of wealth in order to provide for himself and have peace, but when he reaches the goal, another difficulty appears: to keep this wealth. So, this chain of problems continues.

It is said that in the time of Jesus, the expression "eye of the needle" was used to denote a very narrow passage, which was opened only at night. Only one bent person could enter this gate. This gate served for those who came to the city at night to hide behind its walls. It was a real salvation for traders, but at the same time a problem. Camels with heavy loads could not pass. It was necessary to drop everything and push through on one's knees. The animal crawled with great effort. For those who had little and it was easy to pass, for others it was a real hassle. More than once because of wealth, someone was killed and injured. Therefore, wealth provides some security, but does not solve all problems, and often creates new ones. Concerns about saving wealth or using it can make your head spin so much that there will be very little room for the spiritual. Someone said: if evil cannot capture you, it gives you many things to do.

The call to lose everything, become free and reduce oneself to the brink of poverty was not for everyone. In this material world with its modern values, Christ offered only a few the path of complete renunciation of earthly things. Today we call them monks, nuns, hermits, wanderers.

Blessed Lubomyr Huzar says: "The poor is the one who has God. A poor man, in fact, can have enormous wealth. For example, God's gift is a talent that can be used for the good of others. You and I know that there are a huge number of people in the world who will never be rich, no matter what they do. But they always remain with God."

It is possible to be poor both with a large capital and without any property. One is poor and does not have excessive interest in government-provided welfare, though accepting it with gratitude when given and not making excessive problems when it is necessary to get rid of it. Abiding in God is the way to God's kingdom for those who are willing to leave everything to follow Jesus. The most difficult thing is to leave everything, starting with your heart -- to have no attachment and dependence. Even when everyone tells you that it's all yours, you say to your heart: "It's all God's."

Dear believers! What should we do today to grasp eternal life? It is necessary to live an entire life with dignity. The modern world in which we live is very different from the world in which the evangelists lived. However, the person remains the same. He or she has the same desire for happiness, the same commandments of God, the same temptations and the same sins. Everything is the same as it was before, just in a different form.


