

A Gift From God

It was mother's birthday and the whole family gathered while mother opened her gifts. As she unwrapped the paper and ribbons from her gifts, her four-year-old daughter picked up a discarded bow and placed it on her mother's head. She giggled and said, "Look! Mommy is a gift!" Everyone laughed until the truth of what the little girl said had been indeed realized: that mother is a gift, a gift from God!

Our Lord gives us many gifts during the course of our life. One precious gift that He has given to all mankind from one generation to the next is the gift of His own mother, the Holy Virgin Mary. Just as our own mothers love us, comfort us, and protect us from things that could harm us, so, too, does the Mother of God love us, protect us, and intercede for us before her Son and our God.

On October 1st we celebrate the Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God. On this day, the Church remembers and celebrates the occasion when the Mother of God appeared in a vision to Saint Andrew in the church at Blanchernae in Constantinople. In this vision she appeared over the Holy City with her omophorion (mantle) outstretched in a protective manner, promising shelter from harm.

This image of the Holy Virgin has been emblazoned upon the hearts of all Christians since then. We can all turn to the Mother of God in time of distress and know that our prayers will always be heard. She is, indeed, one of our greatest gifts from God!

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Fr. Serhii is available 15 minutes before or immediately after Divine Liturgy to hear confession.



18th Sunday After Pentecost

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

Listening to the words of today's Gospel about the calling of the first apostles, we see that Jesus met Peter and his companions during their work. They worked all night, but did not catch any fish, and fishing was their main labor and means of subsistence. Peter and his companions were experienced fishermen and knew when, how, and where to fish well. However, their unsuccessful work that night reminds us of the truth that even a great life experience does not protect human labor from mistakes and failures.

Christ got into Peter's boat and commanded him to set sail from the earth, and like seeds, the words of Jesus were shed and filled the souls of men. And it came to pass, when the Lord had said unto him, "Cast the net into the sea," that when he had gathered so many fish and the ship was full, suddenly, there appeared before him the image of him that sowed the seed. Simon saw this as an extraordinary, unnatural phenomenon, and so he fell on his knees before Christ and began to pray, "Lord, depart from me, for I am a sinful man!" Horror gripped him and everyone who was with him on the boat. Christ reassured him and said, "...Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men" (Luke 5:10).

"To catch men," means to convert them to Christ God. When the 70 apostles returned from preaching, they joyfully boasted to the Lord that the demons also obeyed them. "Do not rejoice that the demons obey you," Christ said. "Your names are written in heaven."

Jesus Christ also endowed the apostles with this authority. Before ascending to heaven, sending the apostles to preach, Jesus Christ said, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to the whole creation" (Mark 16:15). "And these signs will accompany those who believe in my name they will cast out demons; they will speak in new tongues; they will pick up serpents, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not hurt them; they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will recover" (Mark 16:17-18).

A father and son were walking down an unfamiliar path at night holding a flashlight in their hand. The son was a little scared, because the flashlight was not bright enough and illuminated only a small section of the road, and he wanted it to illuminate the whole road. "Look son," said the father, "If you go all the way forward, the flashlight illuminates the road farther and farther until you reach the goal."

So, in our spiritual life, God does not enlighten us all at once through life, but little by little, as needed. For if the Lord revealed to us all the way from beginning to end, we, seeing all the difficulties on it, could be frightened, discouraged, and when we approach those difficulties gradually, strengthened by life experience and hardened in the spiritual struggle, we easily overcome them.

Dear believers! This Sunday's Gospel assures us that only hope in God, and trusting in His mercy, can strengthen us physically and spiritually, giving us courage to overcome various difficulties in life, and helping us to walk the path of our lives with confidence.

SUNDAY OBLIGATION: Bishop Kurt revoked the dispensation, regarding the Sunday precept or obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy, on June 6, 2021. Watching the live stream no longer fulfills the obligation to assist at Divine Liturgy. However, the Bishop reminds everyone that "just as before the pandemic, anyone is relieved of the obligation for serious reason such as sickness, immobility, fear, caring for someone else, to protect your own health, or the health of others."
