**The Feast of the Encounter:** This Wednesday, February 2, is the 40th day of the Nativity, the *Feast of the Meeting of Our Lord with Simeon and Anna in the Temple*. When Joseph and Mary brought the infant Jesus to the Temple to dedicate him to God, in accordance with the Law, they met the prophet Simeon, who was promised he would not see death until he saw the salvation of Israel. When he saw the infant, he took Jesus from His mother's arms and uttered his hymn which begins, "Now, O, Lord, you may dismiss your servant in peace, according to your word..." (Lk 2:29). This hymn is chanted each night at Vespers since it is sincere prayer to have witness the Lord's saving power each day and be dismissed for a peaceful evening. Liturgy for the holy day will be celebrated at 9 AM at Patronage Church and 6 PM at St. Gregory.

#### The Three Holy Hierarchs

**St. Basil the Great** came from a family of saints. He built monasteries and hospitals and took care of poor children. He even wrote a liturgy that we use ten times a year.

**St. John Chrysostom** was a famous speaker and they called him "golden-mouthed". He showed us how to live God's way in our every day lives. He also wrote the Divine Liturgy that we celebrate most of the time.

**St. Gregory the Theologian** understood God's words and tried to explain them to us. He studied the Holy Scriptures and wrote about the Holy Trinity. He was a thinker who shared his love of God.

The Three Hierarchs were among the greatest teachers in the church. They tried to lead people to worship God. They were Bishops and were later called the luminaries of the Church. The Three Hierarchs appeared in a vision to the Patriarch of Constantinople, St. John Mavropus and explained to him that they were equal in the eyes of God. This was when it was decided that we would celebrate the Three Hierarchs on the same day January 30th.
