Father's Day:

Dear brothers and sisters!

Today we celebrate Father's Day. The father for each of us is an educator, defender, teacher and friend, to whom we owe basic skills, life principles and values. Children can always count on the help of a loving father, no matter how old they are, and warm memories of this dearest person remain with us for a lifetime and give support in the most difficult times.

On this day, I join in all the congratulations that are addressed to our dads! I wish them to be with us as long as possible, so that we can please them more and take care of them, love them and communicate with them, because we do not always have this opportunity! Apostles' Fast: We continue the *Apostles' Fast* which runs through June 28, the vigil of the feast of the *Pre-eminent Apostles Peter & Paul.* Unlike the other fast periods, the Apostle's Fast does not have a fixed timespan, rather it begins on the Monday after the Sunday of All Saints and ends the day before the feast. While there is no obligation to fast during this time, it is still considered a penitential period in the Metropolia of Pittsburgh.

Collection for The Children's Home: Patronage Church will again be collecting items for The Children's Home in Catonsville, a residential care facility that provides both long- and short-term services to youth 13 to 21 years of age. They are in need of new or gently used sports equipment for middle and high school students, new ear buds, new adult size swimsuits, new art canvas - any size, and gently used MP3 players. Donations can be dropped off in the back room of Patronage Church, marked "The Children's Home." Donations will be accepted through July 3.

The Orientale Lumen XXVI Conference will be held as a "virtual" conference in June 2022 on the theme of *Nicaea and the Date of Pascha/Easter*. The Second Sunday after Pentecost

And as Jesus passed by the sea of Galilee, He saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishermen. And He said to them, "Follow me, I will make you fishermen of men." And they immediately left the net and followed Him. And He went on thence, and saw other two brethren, James, the son of Zebedee, and John his brother, who in the boat with his father Zebedee had repaired their nets; and He called them. They immediately, abandoning the boat and their father, followed Him. And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing every sickness and every disease among the people. (Matt. 4:18 - 23).

Dear brothers and sisters!

This Sunday we read the story of the evangelist Matthew about Jesus' calling of the first apostles. With this event, Christ invites us to focus on his vocation.

Jesus Christ often and in different ways addresses people and constantly invites everyone to build their lives with Him, according to His teachings and guidelines. He suggests, advises, asks us to follow certain rules in life that will help us build our lives reliably. If we seek happiness in life from God, or try to hear God's voice, listen to the advice. Guidance that Jesus gives us will create a happy life. Christ expresses these appeals and invitations in keeping the commandments, practicing constant prayer, and receiving the Holy Mysteries. Following these counsels expresses the spirit of our faith, hope, love, trust in Jesus, and cooperation with Him. One elder often prayed to God that his disciples would enter paradise with him after his death. This is how the Lord answered this prayer to the elder. There was a feast in the neighboring monastery, and the old man and his disciples were invited there. The old man did not want to go, but in a dream he was told to leave only after his disciples. The time came and the elder's disciples went to the feast. On the way they met a poor wounded man. They asked, "What's the matter with you?" The unfortunate man replied: "I was already sick, and then a thief attacked me. I am lying here, and there is no one who would have mercy on me and bring me to some nearby house. "To this they replied: "We feel sorry for you, but we have nothing to help you." And they went on. Soon this poor and unhappy man was met by an old man – the abbot. Learning of the cause of his grief, took the unfortunate on his shoulders and carried him. At
