

Third Sunday after Pentecost

Dear brothers and sisters!

"When your eye is clean, then your whole body will be clean," Christ said. Let's just think what strong words these are! What are they telling us? When a person is pure, when she is righteous, she looks at everyone with love and righteousness. She does not look for enemies among others; she does not look for flaws in others; she is not looking for ways to blame another person. This is because her eye is clear. She loves her neighbor.

Many people know that sometimes seminary students leave school and walk away. So it was with one seminarian who had recently left school. It did not happen suddenly. Slowly, step by step, the seminarian's faith waned, his enthusiasm cooled, and his zeal for the spread of Christianity disappeared. His source of inspiration withered, his soul became indifferent, and his eyes became dry and lethargic.

What is the reason for such a change?!

Did the devil manage to seduce this guy and fill his soul with doubts? - No.

Maybe an alternative career has made you dizzy? - No, too.

The seminarian just made a mistake. Instead of talking to God, he focused on talking about Him. In this way, his theology lost its meaning.

"For from Him, through Him and in Him are all things. We send glory to Him forever and ever."

In the words of the Gospel this Sunday, Christ invites each of us, in search of happiness and the way to heaven, to trust Him, to choose Him as our reliable guide to eternal life.

An ancient Chinese legend tells of a woman who lost her only son. In deep despair, she went to the old man and asked what prayers or medicines could bring her son back to life.

The old man listened attentively to the woman, but did not ask anything, only ordered her to bring him a grain of mustard, taken from a home where there was never grief. "It will help free your life from pain," said the old man.

The woman immediately went in search of this magic grain. At first she came to the majestic palace and, hoping that she had found the right place, began to explain: they say I am looking for a house that has never been in trouble. However, she was told about the misfortunes that had recently shaken the house and its occupants.

Then the woman thought: I had to go through such a great misfortune, then who better than me can support these people in grief? So she stayed in the palace for a while to comfort the owners, and then continued to search for the grain. But wherever she went, she heard stories of troubles and misfortunes. In the end, she became so obsessed with this search and consolation of upset people that she soon forgot about the old man's request. Thus, the search for the grain
