### Rush forward!

One Olympic champion in running was asked about the secret of success. His answer has a profound meaning in the life of every Christian:


"The only way to win a competition is to forget the previous victories that filled you with false pride and the previous defeats that enveloped you in unnecessary fear. Every competition is a new beginning. The main thing is to rush forward to the finish line. Forget about past achievements and defeats. Rush to the goal. Rush forward!" Lloyd John Ogilvie

(John 1:26). And at the baptism, the sky opened and the Heavenly Father Himself, in the presence of many people and John the Baptist, testified that Jesus Christ is His beloved Son. The Prophet and Forerunner John testifies about Jesus Christ, pointing Him out to the disciples: "Behold the Lamb of God, Who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29). Similar words are announced by the prophet Isaiah, testifying about the Messiah as follows: "He took upon Himself our infirmities and bore our diseases... He was covered with sores for our sins and tormented for our iniquities; the punishment of our world was upon Him, and with His wounds we are healed" (Is. 53:4-5).

Today, Christ comes into the world for His earthly public service.... At the age of thirty, the Savior accepts baptism. Why did this happen? This happened because precisely at the age of thirty, according to Jewish customs and laws, a person was given the right and opportunity to present his teachings, to teach. Until that time, Christ lived in Nazareth, "growing and strengthening in spirit, gaining wisdom..." (Lk. 2:40).

When in Noah's time, after the global flood, a dove announced the receding of water, so today the appearance of a dove was a sign that the spiritual flood was ending. The Holy Spirit appeared in the form of a bird, which is pure, loving humanity, humble, because the Holy Spirit is the source of purity, the teacher of humility and submission. Therefore, all icon painters use the form of a dove when depicting the Holy Spirit in their icons.

Dear believers! I congratulate everyone on this great holiday of the Epiphany, and I wish that each of us, through the gift of sanctification that the Savior gives us, and through the knowledge of the truth, which is achieved thanks to the appearance of God to the world, will receive God's blessing in this life and reach a blessed life in eternity!

## Sermon on Epiphany

Dear brothers and sisters! Today is dedicated to one of the important events of our church—the appearance of One God in three persons to humanity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Holy Fathers of the Church, in particular St. Gregory the Theologian, explain this as follows: "first God gives His Revelation to man, and only then reveals Himself to the world, coming into this world, combining in Himself two natures - human and divine, being at the same time the Son of God and Man."

The testimony of the Heavenly Father about Jesus Christ as his Son means the equality of the deity, the reflection of the perfection of the Heavenly Father, our Creator, a clear image of His being, His essence. St. John Chrysostom describes the testimony of the Father as follows: "This is my Son, together with me he sent the Holy Spirit upon himself and at the same time he received the Spirit he sent; he was born before the ages, not made.... This is my Son by nature, and not by grace, my Son and eternal, like me, and not younger, not the one who received existence later. My Son is consubstantial with Me, as light from light, as life from life, as truth from truth, as strength from strength, as God from God. I gave birth, He will be born; there is nothing mediocre between Me and Him.... The name of birth is human, and the eternal birth is mysterious" (St. John Chrysostom, speech on the words "This is My Beloved Son"). About the Son of God, this is sung on the morning of the Epiphany: "All-luminous Word, You are sent by the Father to drive away the evil darkness of the night; and You come to eradicate the sins of people, and to give birth to bright sons [and daughters] by Your baptism in the streams of the Jordan, O Blessed One" (Matins of the Epiphany, irmos of the 4th Ode). St. John Chrysostom asks the question: why is Epiphany the day Jesus was baptized, and not the day he was born? And he answers that the day of the Epiphany, on which he was baptized and sanctified the essence of the waters, is real. On the feast of the Epiphany, Christ became known to everyone, because when He was born, people did not recognize Him (St. John Chrysostom, "The Word on the Day of the Epiphany", p. 2). John the Baptist himself confirmed that after the birth, people did not know the Savior: "He stands among you Whom you do not know"
