**Answer:** It is generally accepted by historians that "Church Slavonic represents a later stage of Old Church Slavonic, and is the continuation of the liturgical tradition introduced by two Thessalonian brothers, Saints Cyril and Methodius, in the late 9th century..." As it has evolved, its written and spoken form differs somewhat depending on location and nationality.
