ASK THE DEACON - This week's question: Why does the deacon read the Gospel?

Answer: The proclaiming of scripture in church is assigned to the order of reader. Because the Gospels have a special importance as representing Christ, the Gospel proclamation is assigned to the deacon. The deacon has received a sacramental order but not a priestly (presbyters and bishops) order. So, it is fitting for the deacon to be the herald of the Gospel since it is the focus of the first part of the Divine Liturgy, the service of the word. This is then followed by the Eucharistic sacrifice, offered by all but with and through the presbyter/bishop who is ordained as priest. At other services (e.g. Matins, Moleben) where the Eucharist is not offered, it is the priest (not the deacon, usually) who reads the Gospel.
