"ASK THE DEACON" - THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: Why do we refer to Mary as the Theotokos?

ANSWER: This designation was given to Mary at the Council of Ephesus AD 431. It is formed from two words in Greek, Theo=God and tokos=childbearing. Although it is applied to Mary, it is really addressing a controversy that had arisen about Jesus. Some held that it was only correct to say that Mary was Christotokos. Ephesus decreed that Jesus is one person who is God and Man and that Mary was pregnant with and gave birth to that one divine person, so it is correct to say she is Theotokos. It is difficult to translate Theotokos precisely into English. In Slavonic it is rendered Bohoroditsa meaning Birthgiver of God.
